

On April 13, 2021, my 26 year old son, Jason Krell, and 6 other crewmen from the Seacor Power went missing at sea. Midday, the Power left Port Fourchon for her final journey with 19 crewmen on board. It was merely miles off the coast of Louisiana and in only 55 feet of water when a storm formed and the boat capsized. 6 survived, 6 were found deceased, and 7 remain missing to this day. The Seacor 7 families never heard from our loved ones again.

Jason has always loved the beach and the ocean. It was no surprise he chose a career which took him out to the depths. He graduated from Texas Tech University with a degree in Geophysics. He is the perfect example of working hard for what you want in life. My beautiful boy, Jason was just starting the life he worked hard for. A Personal Locator Beacon could have saved his life. It would have given him a chance. We could have found my Jase, but sadly I didn't know about PLB's. I do now, and I strongly believe every single offshore worker should have this life saving device. We can't let this tragedy happen to anyone else!

Jason's Beacon was formed as a nonprofit in Texas by the mother, sister, and aunt of one of the Seacor Power disaster's seven missing crewmen, Jason Krell our name-sake. They are a 501c3 tax exempt nonprofit.

They learned through the Seacor tragedy that finding individuals lost at sea is extremely difficult and too often unsuccessful. That the vast majority of offshore workers are not provided life saving PLBs-personal locator beacons by the companies they work for, to wear while they are in transport by boat and on locations working offshore, and the devices are cost prohibitive for many individual workers. Until the day that offshore companies are mandated or choose to afford these life saving devices, Jason's Beacon, through your generous donations, plans to buy and gift them to US offshore workers and encourage them to wear them at all times because we think their life is worth it.

PLBs work by sending a signal within seconds of being activated to a network of search and rescue satellites that notify search and rescue operations, such as the US Coast Guard, of the person's GPS location.
