On April 13, 2021, my 26 year old son, Jason Krell, and 6 other crewmen from the Seacor Power went missing at sea. Midday, the Power left Port Fourchon for her final journey with 19 crewmen on board. It was merely miles off the coast of Louisiana and in only 55 feet of water when a storm formed and the boat capsized. 6 survived, 6 were found deceased, and 7 remain missing to this day. The Seacor 7 families never heard from our loved ones again.

Jason has always loved the beach and the ocean. It was no surprise he chose a career which took him out to the depths. He graduated from Texas Tech University with a degree in Geophysics. He is the perfect example of working hard for what you want in life. My beautiful boy, Jason was just starting the life he worked hard for. A Personal Locator Beacon could have saved his life. It would have given him a chance. We could have found my Jase, but sadly I didn't know about PLB's. I do now, and I strongly believe every single offshore worker should have this life saving device.We can't let this tragedy happen to anyone else!
